



BOXING REGULATIONS

4.1. GENERAL TERMS

The boxing competitions shall be organised in accordance with the most recent IBA Technical Rules and AOB Competition Rules (IBA Technical & Competition Rules) of the International Boxing Association (IBA) unless otherwise stated. In case of disagreement in the interpretation of these rules, the English text shall be regarded as authoritative.

All boxers participating in the 2022 FISU University World Cup Combat Sports must be borne between 01/01/1997 and 31/12/2003.

The programme and duration of competitions are fixed by the FISU in agreement with the Organising Committee and the ITC. The competitions shall last six days and include individual events in the following weight categories:

Each boxer must have a valid IBA medical record book.

Boxer quota

Each university is authorised to enter up to 13 competitors (7 men and 6 women with a maximum of one athlete per weight category) and five officials.

Each delegation can have the following number of officials:

- 1 athlete: 1 official
- 2 to 5 athletes: up to 2 officials



- 6 to 13 athletes: up to 3 officials

A country can be represented in each weight category by a maximum of two different universities.

The function of the sport's official can be Coach, Team Leader, Team Official, Doctor and Medical Personnel.

Universities shall declare their starters to the Technical Committee at the latest 24 hours before the General Weigh-In.

At the first General Technical Meeting, the Head of Delegation or his/her representative shall confirm and sign the official list of competitors accredited by the CIC.

4.2. PRE-COMPETITION PROCEDURE

Three months before the Cup, the Organising Committee has the right to collect 25% of the total cost of stay per athlete and official from participating universities.

The official draw shall follow IBA regulations.
